Year 1 – Spring 2023

This term our learning journey is called 'Flying High'. We will be following a young boy called Louis on his time travelling journey back in time to learn all about the 'History of Flight'. Louis will lead us to meet famous aviators in order to find out about their world records and life changing inventions. We will be carrying out scientific investigations along the way as we become aeroplane experts! Get ready to take off!

We are historians

History knowledge and skills will include:

- Studying the lives of significant individuals in history who have contributed to national achievements.
- Look at key events in the past and present.
- Know where people and events fit within a chronological framework.
- Identify ways we find out about the past using a variety of sources.



We are scientists

Science knowledge and skills will include:

- Identify and name a variety of everyday materials and their properties.
- Distinguish what everyday objects are made from (and identify their uses).
- Group together everyday materials based upon their properties.
- Investigating forces and how things move.
- Making observations about forces and suggest ways to test their ideas.



We are geographers

Geography knowledge and skills will include:

- Using information books and pictures as sources of information.
- Exploring world and UK maps.
- Naming and locating the world's seven continents and 5 oceans.
- Using aerial photographs to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.



English

Grammar

- Continue to use some sentence punctuation correctly such as capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.
- To add suffixes to root words where the root word spelling remains unchanged for example: -ing, -ed, -es and -s.
- Spell words correctly using phonics and make phonetically plausible attempts at unknown words.

Children will focus on spellings linked to the sounds and spelling choices they have covered in their phonics sessions.

Writing

- Continue to say a sentence out loud before writing it.
- Use clear letter shapes and sizes in writing.
- Form capital letters correctly and match them to their lower-case letters.
- Sequence sentences to create a narrative of a real-life experience.
- Use labels and sub-headings to create a simple non-fiction leaflet about famous aviators.

Maths

- Count forwards in ones to 20 and beyond. Count backwards down to 0 from 20.
- Order numbers up to 20 including solving missing number problems.
- Read and write numbers up to 100 as numerals and begin to read and write as words.
- Understand + = symbols and record number sentence using these.
- Add or subtract 2 single digit numbers using equipment where needed.
- Solve some simple one step problems including addition, subtraction, doubling, halving and sharing.
- Practically grouping to find simple fractions of objects, numbers and quantities e.g. ½ and ¼.
- Count up in 2's, 5s and 10s, spotting patterns in the numbers.
- Explore and measure length and height using non-standard units of measure before learning to measure to the nearest centimetre.

Use objects at home to practically count, order, add and subtract numbers to 10 and 20.



We will be celebrating successes and feeling proud of ourselves and others. Discussions will focus on ways to build confidence, the importance of resilience and how to overcome obstacles that may get in the way.

Music - Knowledge and Skills

We will be using our voices to sing and chant along to a piece of music. We will also be using musical instruments to copy repeated rhythms and also create our own sequences of percussion sounds to add to music.

Art – Knowledge and skills

We will be exploring the different ways in which we can mix paint to then produce pieces of artwork inspired by the artist Vincent Van Gogh. We will also be developing our sketching skills when drawing planes.

Computing – Knowledge and Skills

We will be focusing upon e- safety, computer science and simple coding. We will learn how to program using beebots and giving instructions to a friend to follow to move around.

Physical Education – Knowledge and skills

Gymnastics – we will be creating a sequence of balances and exploring ways of travelling by changing speed and direction.

Target games – we will be developing our aim and coordination as well as building on our throwing skills from last term. PE days – Tuesday and Wednesday

DT - Knowledge and skills

We will be designing and making bi-Planes. We will explore the best materials to use before completing our final designs. We will also be experiencing new and exciting recipes in our cooking in the curriculum scheme.

RE - Knowledge and skills

We will be exploring Christianity, its key celebrations, and stories in comparison to other religions. We are also going to explore and gain an understanding of the religion of Islam.

Supporting learning at home

Your child will be set phonics and maths homework on Wednesday, this should be returned by Monday morning. Your child may also be given small additional tasks to target specific areas of learning.

Reading

Children are strongly encouraged to read some of their home reading book **every night** and change this regularly. They have the opportunity to change their reading book on a **Monday, Wednesday or Friday.** This should be recorded in their reading record book as should any additional reading undertaken at home.

It is important to take time to discuss the book and ensure that your child has a good understanding of the text as well as being able to decode the words and read with increasing fluency.

It is also imperative that **you read to your child** and share other stories and books at home to develop their love of reading and extend their vocabulary knowledge.

To support your child, as they progress in our Supersonic Phonics programme, they will receive newsletters outlining the sounds they have been learning and the next group of sounds they will be focusing on. Please reinforce your child's understanding of these sounds by practising reading and writing the words shown.

Statutory Phonics Screening

The children in Year 1 will be completing the statutory phonics screening during the summer term 2023. They will be participating in daily phonics lessons in school as well as opportunities to further embed phonics during lessons. Please support your child at home to practise their phonics skills by reading words in the environment, reading their home reading book regularly as well as sharing other stories, magazines and texts.
