Year 3 – Spring 2023

This term our learning journey is **Invaders.** We will be time travelling back to 63AD and joining the Roman Army to invade Britain. We will be finding out what Britain was like before the Romans invaded and how it changed, we will also need to look out for Boudicca along the way. Our time travel will then take us to Anglo Saxon and Viking Britain. **Get ready to time travel!**

We are scientists

Science knowledge and skills will include

- Investigating the properties of rocks
- Exploring soil and the matter it is made from
- Planning and carrying out an investigation
- Suggest what simple equipment may be needed and consider what constitutes a fair test

We are geographers

Geography knowledge and skills will include

- Locating areas of Europe and the way that Europe has changed as a result of different settlements and land use.
- Studying and comparing the physical and human geography of Rome and Britain.
- Finding out how archaeologists help us find out about the past.
- Hold conversations and group discussions about geographical changes caused through humans.

We are historians

History knowledge and skills will include

- Finding out about the Roman empire and its impact on Britain.
- Exploring life in Celtic and Anglo-Saxon settlements.
- Debating the Viking struggle to overtake England.
- Identify reasons for and results of people's actions and understand why historical figures may have done what they did.

Grammar

- Formation of nouns using prefixes.
- Use of conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions.
- Headings and sub-headings.

Writing

- Use appropriate grammar and vocabulary to create a historical story.
- Use simple organisational devices to create a non-fiction piece about each of the four historical figures.
- Plan, draft, evaluate and edit our writing.
- Write and compose an email using paragraphs.

Read your reading book every day and quiz regularly on Accelerated Reader to reach your points target each half term.

Maths

- Estimate and use inverse operations to check answers to a calculation
- Count up and down in tenths.
- Identify right angles.
- Identify symmetrical and non-symmetrical 2D and 3D shapes.
- Multiply two-digit numbers by a one-digit numbers.
- Read Roman numerals to 100 (I to C) and know that over time, the numeral system changed to include the concept of zero and place value.
- Estimate and read time with increasing accuracy to the nearest minute
- Convert between different units of measure.

Accelerated Reader

Your child will complete a star test through Accelerated Reader each term, which will generate a ZPD, based on their comprehension and vocabulary understanding. Your child will then choose a book within that ZPD from school. Once your child completes a book, they will complete a quiz in school. Remember you can log into Home Connect to see your child's AR bookcase and guizzes.

Your child's AR book is their home reading book; please ensure that you listen to your child read regularly and write in their home reading record book.

It is also important that you spend time reading to your child and sharing stories and books at home with them to develop their love of reading.

In class your child will further develop their reading skills through guided reading.

They will also enjoy story time daily with the class teacher.

Times tables in phase 3/4

In Year 4 your child will be completing the statutory times tables assessment during the summer term. Children will be practising times tables daily in school. Times tables is a key area of learning in Years 3 and 4, please support your child at home to practise their times tables every day.
