Year 4 - Autumn 2025

This term our learning journey is **Ice Worlds.** After discovering a mysterious egg, which has travelled all the way from Antarctica, we will investigate what animal could be inside and what it will need to survive once it hatches. While taking care of the animal, we will continue to learn all about its home (Antarctica) and how its kind and other animals have adapted to such extreme conditions.

Along the way, we will track the routes of historical explorers Robert Scott and Roald Amundsen, learning about their famous expeditions and finding out about their fate.

Later, a visit from an icy character will require the children's assistance to help return the classroom back to normal.

We are scientists

Science knowledge and skills will include:

- Identify that animals need the right types of food and nutrition, and that nutrition comes from what they eat.
- Compare how things move on different surfaces and how forces act upon them.
- Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure or research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C)

We are geographers

Geography knowledge and skills will include:

- Use maps, atlases, and digital mapping to locate countries.
- Identify the Arctic and Antarctic Circle, the Northern and Southern Hemisphere.
- Explore specific features of regions including climate, weather and seasons.
- Identify similarities and differences between regions.
- Track the routes of famous explorers of Antarctica.

We are historians

History knowledge and skills will include:

- Carry out a study on famous people from history (Robert Scott, Roald Amundsen).
- To explore historical sources and use these to learn about events from the past.

English

Grammar

- Word: Difference between plural and possessive
- Fronted adverbials
- Use of paragraphs
- Use of apostrophes and inverted commas
- Appropriate choice of noun and pronouns.

Writing

- Prepare poems to read aloud.
- Use appropriate grammar and vocabulary to create an adventure story.
- Use simple organisational devices to create a nonfiction piece about famous explorers
- Evaluate and edit our writing proposing changes.



Maths

- Count in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1000.
- Round any number to the nearest 10,100 and 1000.
- Order and compare numbers beyond a 1000 and know the place value of each digit.
- Add and subtract numbers with up to 4 digits using mental methods and jottings.
- Multiply two-digit and three-digit numbers by a onedigit number using a formal written method.
- Recognise and write decimal equivalents to one quarter, a half and three quarters.
- Convert between different units of measure.

PSHE/RSE

The children will be focusing on families and friendships, safe relationships, respecting ourselves and others and mental wellbeing.

Music - Knowledge and Skills

The children will be finding out about the artists Nerys Levy and David McEown and will experiment with mixing a variety of colours to make an Antarctic landscape and will develop their line work through observational drawings.
