Our learning journey this term is 'Tudor Treasures'

As historians we will:

Learn about the Tudor period and know where it sits on a timeline of British history.

Learn about the reigns of Henry VII, Henry VIII and Elizabeth I and how they changed the course of British history.

Learn why Henry VIII broke away from the Catholic church and the impact it had upon the course of British history.

Learn what life was like in Tudor England and compare the experiences of rich and poor Tudors. Learn about the great Tudor explorers and the impact of their exploration.

Learn about the causes and consequences of the Spanish Armada.

Learn about the significance of Ludlow during the Tudor period (local history study).

As geographers we will

Compare modern day and Tudor maps of the world.

Plot the route taken by Drake when he circumnavigated the globe.

Locate the site of the Battle of Bosworth on a map of the UK.

Locate Ludlow on a map of the UK.

As scientists we will:

Learn about reversible and irreversible changes in relation to different materials (dying fabrics, creating a wax seal).

English

Apply existing knowledge to produce the following genres of writing linked to our journey: an obituary, descriptive writing, poetry, a non-chronological report, a recount, a diary, a narrative set in Tudor England, a formal letter, a persuasive text and a play script.

Evaluate, edit and improve written work.

Apply expected Year 6 punctuation (commas, colons, semicolons, hyphens and brackets).

Focus on improving our GPS knowledge and understanding.

Use VIPERS to develop reading skills across a range of texts.

Maths

Apply the four operations in a variety of contexts to demonstrate fluency and problem-solving skills.

Apply prior learning and existing knowledge to answer reasoning questions.

Combine areas of maths to solve more complex problems.

Solve multi step problems involving several areas of maths.

Identify areas of revision and build confidence in these areas.

Tackle 'no-goal' questions to develop fluency.

Children will focus on the statutory Year 5/6 spellings from the National Curriculum as well as spelling rules, applying them to their written work where appropriate.

Homework and Take Home Tasks

- Your child should continue to work on their SATs '10 Minute Tasks' homework books (completing a weekly task in each).
- They should also be logging onto Monster SATs regularly for independent revision and when directed by staff.

Your child will complete a star test through Accelerated Reader each term which will generate a ZPD based on their comprehension and vocabulary understanding.
