# History knowledge and skills will include

- Exploring life during the Ancient Egyptian civilisation
- Finding out about the customs and beliefs of the Ancient Egyptians
- Comparing Ancient Egypt to Ancient Greece and the Mayan Civilisation
- Exploring the legacy of the civilisations

# We are geographers

# Geography knowledge and skills will include

- Using the correct geographical language to describe locations we are studying
- Using atlases, globes and maps to locate continents, countries and cities
  - Exploring the human and physical characteristics of the countries we are studying
- Comparing the characteristics of different locations

# We are scientists

# Science knowledge and skills will include

- Investigating which materials will dissolve in a liquid to form a solution and how to recover a substance from a solution
- Learning how mixtures might be separated, including through filtering, sieving and evaporating
- Exploring the uses of different everyday materials
- Using our scientific knowledge and experience to explore ideas and raise questions.



# <u>English</u>

- Apply existing knowledge to produce the following genres of writing linked to our journey: an obituary, descriptive writing, poetry, a non-chronological report, a recount, a diary, a narrative set in Egypt, a formal letter, a persuasive text and a play script.
- Evaluate, edit and improve written work.
- Apply expected Year 6 punctuation (commas, colons, semicolons, hyphens and brackets).
- Focus on improving our GPS knowledge and understanding.
- Use VIPERS to develop reading skills across a range of texts

# <u>Maths</u>

- Apply the four operations in a variety of contexts to demonstrate fluency and problem-solving skills.
- Apply prior learning and existing knowledge to answer reasoning questions.
- Combine areas of maths to solve more complex problems.
- Solve multi step problems involving several areas of maths.
- Identify areas of revision and build confidence in these areas.
- Tackle 'no-goal' questions to develop fluency.

<u>RE/PSHE/RSE</u> We will be learning about world religious leaders and exploring relationships.

<u>Music – Knowledge and Skills</u> We will be listening to, appraising and creating music linked to the Ancient Egyptian time period.

# Supporting learning at home

- You child will also receive weekly spelling homework linked to their spelling rules.
- Reading at home is still an essential part of your child's homework and they should be encouraged to read for at least 10 minutes each day.
- Children should continue to practise times tables as this will increase their fluency in other areas of maths.
- Your child will be given a log on to <u>www.monster-learning.com</u> where they will find a wealth of materials to support their independent revision.

## **Reading**

Your child will continue to complete a star test through Accelerated Reader each term which will generate a ZPD based on their comprehension and vocabulary understanding. They will be given time each day to read in class and to take quizzes. Your child will also listen to their teacher read daily from a class text. They will work on reading based tasks in their journals linked to VIPERS.
