Please ensure that we have accurate and up to date information e.g. address, emergency contact numbers, (especially mobile phone numbers) and any relevant medical information pertinent to your child.

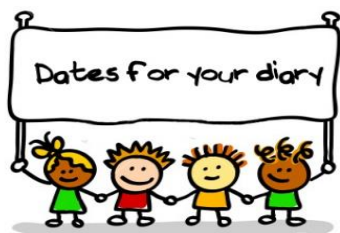
It is your responsibility to make us aware of any changes
