# Geographers

As *geographers*, create a globe or a map of the world using materials of your choice! This must include labelling of the 7 continents, 5 oceans and the United Kingdom.

You could even add a real flight path to your map that you have researched and include the names of the countries it stops at.







#### **Historians**

As *historians*, research an amazing aviator! This could be someone we learn about at school or someone who has inspired you by breaking a world record! You need to present your interesting facts clearly and creatively by making a PowerPoint, creating a news report video, making a leaflet or a poster.

OR

Create an aviation artefact.

This could be something that is used by a pilot such as a clothing accessory (goggles, scarf, hat) or something used to fly through the ages (compass, radar/control panel).



## **PSHRE**

As well-being warriors, create a poster to encourage resilience and perseverance. We know that the Wright Brothers never gave up on their dream to invent the first ever flying machine and in our classes, we have discussed the meaning of the word 'resilience' and how important it is.

You could include the following questions and answers:


What does 'resilience' mean?
